



**Annual Report of Grants

During 2009, over \$3.3 million in Foundation grants supported a wide variety of important programs in communities all across the country. Following is a brief description of each of these grant-funded programs.

Human Services

211 Palm Beach/Treasure Coast

\$20,000

Lantana, FL

The 211 Call Center is a free, confidential, telephone-based service for Palm Beach County that assists individuals in need 24 hours a day, 365 days a year with information and referral services, crisis counseling, and suicide intervention services.

Adopt America Network

\$75,000 (3 grants)

Toledo, OH

This organization is dedicated to finding permanent adoptive homes for children in foster care from across the United States who have special needs (i.e., those with a history of physical, sexual or emotional abuse; victims of extreme neglect, those who are mentally or medically fragile, sibling groups of two or more, older youth, and /or minority and bi-racial youth) through a broad range of services for both families and the children.

Advocates for Basic Legal Equality

\$25,000

Toledo, OH

The AmeriCorps Homelessness Prevention and Housing Opportunity Project provides information, education, and legal assistance to help low-income individuals and families maintain or acquire safe and affordable housing in Lucas County.

Arts Commission of Great Toledo

\$30,000 (2 grants)

Toledo, OH

Young Artists at Work is a six-week, arts-based summer work program for economically and culturally diverse high school students living in the Toledo area.

Beach House, Inc.

\$25,000

Toledo, OH

Beach House is a 7-bedroom emergency homeless shelter that provides families, single women or women with children, men with children and married couples from the greater Toledo area, northwest Ohio, and southeast Michigan with a warm, clean, safe environment for up to 60 days and assists them in identifying and finding resources to address the problems that impacted their self-sufficiency.

Bittersweet, Inc.

\$40,000

Whitehouse, OH

The Vocational Day Program is a vocational and life skills assessment program designed to provide a comprehensive, individualized plan that can be used by family or guardians when making residential, educational, and vocational decisions with the adolescent or adult with autism.

Cherry Street Mission Ministries

\$25,000

Toledo, OH

Caleb House is a 1,200 square foot, four bedroom house built to serve as the residence for four men for up to two years while they complete their education or become employed and save money for a permanent residence. Those eligible to live in Caleb House include men who are 18 years or older, have no source of income, have no place to live, and are not using alcohol or other substances.

Children's Case Management Organization, Inc.

\$25,000

West Palm Beach, FL

The Kin Support Project educates and supports caregivers, usually over the age of 40, who have unexpectedly taken over the care of a relative's child. The program helps to increase the caregiver's knowledge and use of essential community resources as well as connect the caregiver with informal, supportive networks.

Children's Place at Home Safe

Lake Worth, FL

The Safety Net program provides help for any adult, child, or family who has been affected by domestic assault and/or family violence through a continuum of services (crisis intervention and stabilization, case management, court advocacy, and individual and group therapy) that help the individual or family attain safety and stability and develop the strategies and skills needed to live violence-free.

Chrysalis Center

\$30,000

Los Angeles, CA

The Chrysalis Center Employment Program helps homeless and economically disadvantaged individuals in the Los Angeles area with job acquisition skill development, employment, and job retention.

Community Foundation of Collier County

\$25,000

Naples, FL

The Immokalee Initiative was begun to enhance the ability of nonprofit organizations to serve the residents of Immokalee through Board and staff education programs, opportunities for organizations to work together to develop strategies to address unmet community needs, and donor development activities that educate and connect potential donors to the needs in Immokalee.

Esperanza Shelter for Battered Families, Inc

\$45,000 (2 grants)

Santa Fe, NM

The Outreach and Education Program provides information about domestic violence and Esperanza services through presentations to community groups, service providers, and school-age children, and displays of printed materials in local businesses, social service agencies, and at community events. A Volunteer Coordinator position was created to recruit, train, and schedule volunteers to assist the Esperanza Shelter in carrying out a variety of activities including (but not limited to) fundraising, management of in-kind donations and public speaking.

Fair Housing Opportunities of N.W.O.

\$30,000

Toledo, OH

The Predatory Lending Remediation Program is a collaboration between the Fair Housing Center and Northwest Ohio Development Agency to serve homeowners who face foreclosure. The two organizations work together to help homeowners with technical assistance (loan document review and counseling), mortgage remediation or renegotiation, and pre and post-closing counseling including money management training.

Food for Santa Fe

\$25,000

Santa Fe, NM

Feeding the Hungry program provides food for needy families once a week at its drive-through food distribution center. Each adult in the car receives one bag of groceries containing perishable and non-perishable food, milk, and healthy snacks for children.

Food Project

\$30,000

Lincoln, MA

The Food Project's Local Youth Programs engage 170 young people who develop critical life and job skills while working to build a more just and sustainable food system. The participants develop knowledge and skills in the areas of leadership, job skills, diversity, social service and change, healthy eating, sustainable agriculture, and communication.

Good Grief, Inc.

\$25,000

Summit, NJ

Good Grief provides education, advocacy, and year-round peer support groups for grieving children, teens and adults all designed to normalize grief and create resilient communities where children coping with loss grow up emotionally healthy and able to lead meaningful and productive lives.

International Boxing Club

\$50,000 (2 grants)

Toledo, OH

The Learning Center is an after-school program that provides a variety of academic, social, vocational, and service learning opportunities for at-risk youth. Although home work help and academic success are important components, programming extends beyond academics to the development of life skills and positive attitudes and behaviors.

La Cuna Inc.

\$25,000

San Diego, CA

This organization recruits, screens, trains, and supports foster parents who care for Latino children under the age of five as they wait to be returned to their biological families or adopted.

Lighthouse for the Blind of the Palm Beaches

\$15,000

West Palm Beach, FL

This organization's social worker provides individuals ages five and older who are blind, legally blind, or significantly visually impaired with a number of services including information about and referral to low vision services, counseling, and support groups all intended to help the clients cope and function to their highest level possible in spite of their impaired vision.

Mobile Meals of Toledo

\$25,000

Toledo, OH

The Client Assistance Program provides home-delivered meals at a reduced fee to low-income disabled, elderly, convalescing, or chronically ill individuals residing in metropolitan Toledo.

New York Youth at Risk, Inc.

\$20,000

New York, NY

Woman to Woman is a two-year program that works to ensure that teenage mothers and girls at high risk of becoming teen mothers complete their education and develop into self-sufficient and financially independent adults. This voluntary program helps to deter teenage pregnancy, school drop out, delinquent behaviors, and/or permanent dependence on New York City's social services system.

Red Feather Development Group

\$25,000

Bozeman, MT

Red Feather partners with Native American communities to address the severe housing crisis within their nations by building homes, teaching home construction, facilitating home ownership, encouraging volunteerism, and enabling cooperation and understanding among cultures.

Salvation Army

\$10,000

Toledo, OH

The Emergency Social Services program helps individuals become or remain employed through financial assistance for such essentials as the purchase work boots, a car repair so a client can get to his/her job, or the purchase tools needed for a job.

Santa Fe Children's Museum

\$15,000

Santa Fe, NM

The Children's Museum provides a safe place for children ages two through twelve to have fun and learn as they choose from a number of age-appropriate interactive environmental and educational programs and activities.

Santa Fe Mountain Center

\$25,000

Tesuque, NM

The Emergence Program assists and supports Native youth, young adults, and their communities in central New Mexico in reconnecting with the rich traditions and values of their heritage while providing the skills and knowledge necessary for economic, environmental, and social justice development through experiential learning.

Senior Community Centers of San Diego

\$25,000

San Diego, CA

The Support Housing Programs staff helps low-income, high-risk older adults identify and address unmet needs related to homelessness, hunger, substance abuse, mental and physical illnesses, and health care.

Service Corps of Retired Executives – Toledo 80

\$3,000

Toledo, OH

This organization provides volunteer counselors who offer advice on topics such as business plan development, financing, tax issues, and marketing to individuals planning to start their own business or those wanting to improve an existing business.

Toledo Zoological Society

\$20,000

Toledo, OH

Funding allows youth who are members of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Toledo to attend a Saturday afternoon Toledo Zoo program or an overnight Zoo Snoozin' program. Both programs provide education and enrichment activities focused on zoo animals.

University of the Cumberlands Inc

\$15,000

Williamsburg, KY

Scholarships allow Cumberland students to serve as Team Leaders for the Mountain Outreach Program, a student organization that assists low income families in Appalachia by building new homes or helping with home repairs and other infrastructure needs.

Urban Youth Impact

\$4,000

West Palm Beach, FL

The Back 2 School Blast project provides backpacks and school supplies for economically disadvantaged students.

Western Carolina Higher Education Commission

\$20,000

Allendale, SC

The University of South Carolina's Salkehatchie Leadership Institute promotes the development of community leaders, nurtures civic development, and serves as a catalyst for community and economic development.

Women's Opportunity & Resource Development

\$50,000

Missoula, MT

This organization is working to enhance its services for low-income women and families, increase staff efficiency, and create greater financial stability. Some specific activities include a community needs assessment, upgraded technology and technology training, and implementation of a development plan to diversify funding sources.

Ecological Well-Being

Black Swamp Conservancy

\$17,000

Perrysburg, OH

This organization encourages and assists with the conservation and protection of farmland and natural areas in sixteen northwest Ohio counties for the benefit of current and future generations.

Nature's Nursery Center for Wildlife Rehabilitation and Conservation Education

\$20,000

Whitehouse, OH

Nature's Nursery serves as a wildlife rehabilitation center and also promotes the stewardship of Northwest Ohio natural resources by educating people of all ages on the interrelationships between human beings and nature, the need for the care and respect for all areas of conservation, and the understanding of how humans can successfully interact with wildlife while maintaining a respectful distance.

University of Toledo Foundation

Enhancing Environmental Education and Careers is a collaborative effort involving the University of Toledo, the Toledo Early College High School (TECHS), and several local agencies designed to help TECHS students learn about nature and then develop and implement an Ottawa River urban stream restoration project under the guidance of the University of Toledo faculty.

Arts & Culture

52nd Street Project

\$25,000

New York, NY

This organization matches youth between the ages of 9 and 18 from the NYC Clinton neighborhood (Hell's Kitchen) with professional theater artists to create original theater.

Center for Contemporary Arts of Santa Fe

\$25,000

Santa Fe, NM

The Going Green: A Youth Empowerment Project is an environmental media project that allowed Native American teens and young adults to develop media literacy, storytelling structure, video production, and leadership/team-building skills; create a compelling film about current and future energy policies; and advance knowledge of cross-cultural collaborative processes.

Community MusicWorks

\$25,000

Providence, RI

This organization provides an after-school program for urban youth ages 7 – 18 that features mentoring; music instruction on the violin, viola, or cello; and other music related activities designed to improve the participants' self-confidence, communication skills, leadership abilities, and discipline.

DreamYard Drama Project

\$25,000

Bronx, NY

The DreamYard Art Center serves as the home to a number of out-of-school programs for youth in grades 6 – 12 living in the Morrisania neighborhood of Bronx including classic and modern theater performance, visual and cultural arts, poetry, dance, and civic participation. The Art Center also serves as the site for teacher and school administrator professional development in art education.

Lensic Performing Arts Center Corporation

\$25,000

Santa Fe, NM

The Community Sponsorship Program allows nonprofits in northern New Mexico to use the Lensic Performing Arts Center facilities free-of-charge or for a nominal fee for lectures, ceremonies, performances, or fundraising events and to keep the proceeds from the box office. Lensic also operates Tickets Santa Fe at the Lensic, a community box office that sells tickets for Lensic events and for 34 other venues in northern New Mexico at a fee that is far below the standard ticketing charge.

National Dance Institute of New Mexico

\$25,000

Santa Fe, NM

The Santa Fe In-School Program provides 3rd through 5th graders with dance experiences that help them develop the foundational skills and attitudes necessary to succeed in school such as following directions, teamwork, discipline, the value of perseverance, self-esteem, cardiovascular fitness, and sensory motor development through dance while the After-School Program allows selected students to further develop their dance skills.

Toledo Jazz Society dba Art Tatum Jazz Heritage Foundation

\$10,000

Toledo, OH

Tatum Jazz Day is a one-day event that provides an opportunity for selected Toledo Public School 5th and 6th grade students to visit the University of Toledo campus and participate in hands-on activities as they learn about jazz history, music composition, and musical instruments.

Toledo Opera Association

\$7,500

Toledo, OH

Opera on Wheels: Outreach and Education is an age-appropriate opera production presented in over sixty elementary schools throughout northwest Ohio and southeastern Michigan each spring by four young artists recruited from NYC to help students experience the exhilaration and excitement of an operatic performance.

Toledo Repertoire Theater

\$20,000

Toledo, OH

The Rep, the oldest community theater group in northwest Ohio, offers productions that appeal to a broad audience including five Main Stage productions, the EdgyRep series, the annual production of A Christmas Carol, and the Young Playgoers Series presented at local elementary schools.

Toledo Symphony Orchestra

\$510,000 (2 grants)

Toledo, OH

The TSO has served Toledo and northwest Ohio for 65 years providing classical, pops, holiday and family-centered performances in Toledo venues; educational and outreach concerts and small ensemble performances in schools, community centers, homes, and hospitals throughout northwest Ohio; and a newly opened School of Music where private lessons are available for children.

Wild Swan Theater

\$20,000

Ann Arbor, MI

Wild Swan offers high-quality, professional theater productions and educational outreach programs for an estimated 55,000 youth and their family members each year. The programs, designed to foster children's literacy and social skills, self-esteem, emotional intelligence, multi-cultural understanding, and respect for people who might seem "different" from them, are accessible and affordable for all youth including those with special needs.

Young Musicians Foundation

\$25,000

Beverly Hills, CA

The Mentor Artists Program provides a 32-week residency in Los Angeles City and County Schools for ten trained musicians who work with students and teachers in the classroom, participate with the school orchestra, and provide individual instrumental tutoring for elementary and middle school students.

Education

Behind the Book

\$25,000

New York, NY

This organization works to build literacy skills and a reading culture among low-income youth in New York City public schools. The curriculum-based visiting author program motivates students to read by exposing them to authors and stories that reflect their experiences, backgrounds, and communities.

Belmont Day School

\$75,000

Belmont, MA

The Center for Teaching and Learning was established to provide public school educators with an effective educational model through workshops; roundtable discussions and demonstrations of best practices in primary, elementary, and middle school education; a dynamic web presence, a series of publications, and a resource library of print and video materials all with a long-term goal of creating a base for research, curriculum development, and educational thinking.

Educate New Mexico

\$30,000

Albuquerque, NM

This organization provides partial scholarships for K – 6th grade students from low to moderate-income families to attend a private school of their choice.

Florida Gulf Coast University

\$25,000

Fort Myers, FL

SEEDS is a collaborative effort among Florida Gulf Coast University, the Christ Child Society, and other volunteer organizations that utilizes trained adult volunteers to improve the pre-literacy skills of preschool children. SEEDS volunteers read to small groups of children, ask the children questions about the stories, and help the children complete fun activities.

Jefferson Community School

\$7,500

Port Townsend, WA

Established to serve families living on Washington's North Olympic Peninsula, Jefferson Community School is a 6th through 12th grade community-based school for academically motivated students who are interested in a school experience that emphasizes global citizenship and expeditionary learning.

Junior Achievement of Northwest Ohio

\$15,000

Toledo, OH

This organization utilizes trained volunteers from the business community to present the Junior Achievement curriculum on free enterprise, business, and economic fundamentals to students in Toledo Public School classrooms with an emphasis on those in low-income neighborhoods.

Legal Aid of Western Ohio

\$35,000

Toledo, Ohio

The Education Advocacy Initiative attorneys help ensure that students with disabilities and special needs are provided with the services and supports they need within the school setting to help them benefit from available educational opportunities.

Literacy Volunteers of Collier County

\$10,000

Naples, FL

This organization utilizes trained volunteers to teach functionally illiterate adults and adult speakers of other languages to read, write and speak English. The volunteer tutors, who must successfully complete a sixteen hour training program, are matched with one or more adults who want to learn to read English.

Mary Immaculate School

\$25,000

Toledo, OH

Project Focus is an occupational therapy program for students with Sensory Processing Disorders who attend Mary Immaculate School (grades 1-8). The students engage in carefully selected activities designed to improve their ability to concentrate and perform fine motor tasks that directly impact the development of reading and writing skills.

Maumee Valley County Day School

\$208,000

Toledo, OH

Maumee Valley Country Day School is Northwest Ohio's only independent pre-K through 12th grade school. The School is committed to diversity, and enrolls over 480 students representing more than 28 different cultures. The Foundation's challenge grant assisted the School in raising matching funds for the "Under One Roof" campaign.

National Science and Technology Education Partnership

\$25,000

Arlington, VA

Study Buddy is an online peer-to-peer tutoring program designed to address the low math scores of middle and high school students in New York City. The program uses the latest interactive, collaborative technology to pair successful high school math students with those students who are struggling in Algebra or Geometry and lack access to a tutor.

Northwest Maritime Center

\$26,000

Port Townsend, WA

The Puget Sound Explorers – Maritime Discovery Program, which includes both a classroom component and a “hands-on” experience in longboats, adds an intensive maritime curriculum in 7th grade classrooms in the Port Townsend area. This program links the teaching of maritime knowledge and skills with the Washington State 7th grade learning objectives.

Northwest School of Wooden Boat Building

\$56,000

Port Hadlock, WA

The Northwest School of Wooden Boat Building, an accredited vocational school that offers three academic tracks in boatbuilding, added a new 800 square foot Metal Shop. The new facility is used to train certified welders who are in high demand in the area.

Owens Community College Foundation

\$37,500

Perrysburg, OH

The Summer Bridge to Success Program is a year round support program for first-generation college students from targeted Toledo high schools. The program includes a seven-week summer program that acclimates the students to college life and helps them prepare for college-level work, and a coordinator/mentor who meets with the students weekly during the school year to assist them with career development, course selection, registration, and identification of needed supports and services.

Phillips Exeter Academy

\$32,420

Exeter, NH

Tuition assistance was provided for secondary school teachers to attend the 2009 Summer Professional Development Conference.

Public Broadcasting Foundation of N.W.O. - WGTE

\$50,375

Toledo, OH

Knowledge Stream is an archive of videotaped presentations made by authors, historians, scientists, artists, and scholars at venues around Northwest Ohio and Southeast Michigan. The videotapes are packaged for free, on-line access by educators and the community at large at their convenience.

Read for Literacy

\$55,000 (2 grants)

Toledo, OH

This organization offers basic adult literacy tutoring using specially trained volunteers who help illiterate and functionally illiterate persons learn to read and/or to improve their reading skills. (\$25,000 operating support)

Creating Young Readers is a program designed to increase the reading readiness of preschool-age children from low-income families by exposing them to intensive reading and reading-related experiences provided by adult volunteers who have been trained to implement a technique known as Shared Reading. (\$30,000 new program support)

Santa Fe Preparatory School

\$20,000

Santa Fe, NM

Santa Fe Prep is fully accredited, coeducational day school that serves students in grades seven through twelve. One of only six schools in New Mexico accredited by the Independent School Association of the Southwest, Santa Fe Prep is also a member of the National Association of Independent Schools.

Toledo Ballet Association, Inc

\$5,700

Toledo, OH

First Steps is a school-based outreach program for kindergarten students that integrates literature with dance and music. The program was offered in kindergarten classrooms in four Toledo Public Title I Elementary Schools during the 2009-10 school year.

Toledo Day Nursery

\$37,880 (2 grants)

Toledo, OH

This accredited Step Up to Quality pre-school program provides affordable child care for Toledo's working and student parents. The curriculum is designed to enhance the children's educational, social, emotional, and physical development.

Toledo Day Nursery also provided occupational therapy services for selected children with significant delays in their fine motor and sensory motor skill development to help prepare them for success in kindergarten.

Toledo School for the Arts

\$25,000

Toledo, OH

This charter school provides 6th – 12th grade students with creative opportunities to achieve personal and academic success through an arts-based education.

Toledo Science Center (dba Imagination Station)

\$49,200

Toledo, OH

Project Energy: Summer Professional Development Institute is a one-week long training program for 25 Toledo Public School teachers to help them integrate energy issues into their curriculum.

Mental & Physical Health

Alzheimer's Association

\$50,000

Chicago, IL

This research project focuses on the potential of stem cells to offer a new avenue of intervention in the treatment of Alzheimer's disease.

Bridger Clinic

\$30,000

Bozeman, MT

The Reproductive Health Education Project offers direct education about reproductive health, birth control, STI's, decision making, healthy relationships, puberty, avoidance of sexual coercion, and clinic services for teens, women with mental disabilities, and pregnant or parenting teens.

Camp Holiday Trails

\$25,000

Charlottesville, VA

This camp provides day and overnight camping experiences for children ages 5 to 17 who have chronic illnesses that prevent them from attending traditional camps. With volunteer medical staff present to monitor medical conditions, campers are able to participate in typical camp experiences.

David Lawrence Center & Foundation

\$25,000

Naples, FL

David Lawrence Center provides services for adults and children from Collier County who are in need of mental health and substance abuse treatment with the goal of helping these individuals restore or rebuild their lives and remain in the least restrictive environments.

Friends to Youth

\$58,843

Missoula, MT

The Tribal Family Preservation Project provides Family Based Services and Addiction Counseling and Support Services for families referred by the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes of the Flathead Reservation with the goal of helping families stay intact when at least one of the children is at risk for or has been removed due to abuse, neglect, or inability of the family to meet the needs of the child.

Healthy Schools Campaign

\$25,000

Chicago, IL

The Chicago School Nurse Leadership Program (Chicago SNLP) provides Illinois certified school nurses working in the Chicago Public Schools with the knowledge and skills necessary to successfully implement health promoting policies, practices, and programs in Chicago schools.

Hospital Council of Northwest Ohio

\$100,167

Toledo, OH

Lucas County Initiative to Improve Birth Outcomes Project utilizes Community Health Coordinators who identify low income, at-risk women in targeted zip codes and help the women access prenatal care and address basic needs such as lack of transportation, adequate housing, or food, and/or substance abuse all with the goal of the women delivering healthy, full-term babies.

Jumping Mouse Children's Center

\$25,000

Port Townsend, WA

Jumping Mouse Children's Center provides counseling and advocacy for children ages 2 to 12 who are the victims of abuse or neglect. The Center also provides parent education and counseling to strengthen parenting skills.

Planned Parenthood of Greater Northern New Jersey, Inc.

\$35,000

Morristown, NJ

The Center for Family Life Education added an educator so they could provide more youth with the information and decision making tools they need to make responsible choices in their relationships.

Planned Parenthood of Northwest Ohio, Inc

\$30,000

Toledo, OH

The Teen Clinic, for youth ages 19 and under, offers a full range of reproductive health care services as well as education on sexuality, abstinence, and birth control methods aimed at preventing sexually transmitted infections, reducing teen pregnancy, and promoting responsible, healthy choices.

Toledo-Lucas County CareNET

\$25,000

Toledo, OH

The Voluntary Specialty Network program recruits and coordinates the services of volunteer medical specialists (cardiologists, neurologists, oncologists, orthopedic surgeons, and other medical specialties) to provide care for low-income Lucas County residents who do not have public or private healthcare coverage.

Victory Center

\$25,000

Toledo, OH

This organization provides a number of palliative, support, and education services for cancer patients and their family members from Northwest Ohio and Southeastern Michigan.

\$10,330

Washington, DC

This national membership organization provides education, information, and other resources for private and public foundations engaged in grantmaking.

Foundation Center

\$2,000

Cleveland, OH

This national organization provides information and resources designed to assist nonprofit organizations in the grant seeking process. The Center provides databases, print resource materials and training sessions at libraries across the country, including the Toledo/Lucas County Public Library.

Ohio Grantmakers Forum

This state membership organization provides education, information, and other resources for private and public foundations engaged in grantmaking.

This organization conducts a workplace campaign in northwest Ohio to support nonprofit agencies that are dedicated to social equality, action, and change.
